'Before I Forget' is Fiona Phillips' account of growing up within a complex family. During her childhood her father could sometimes be distant and demanding, while her mother was always the devoted wife and the steady heart of the family. Both parents were later diagnosed with Alzheimer's disease.

Keeping Mum / Marianne Talbot

When her mum was diagnosed with Alzheimer's disease, Marianne Talbot decided she couldn't put her into a care home. Instead, for five years, she looked after her mum in her own home. For nearly three of those years, she chronicled the fears and frustrations, the love and the laughter, and the tears and the trauma of caring.
